### 1916 Commemoration Initiative

To commemorate the centenary of the 1916 Rising and to celebrate 100 years since the Proclamation of the Irish Republic, the Government has asked the Defence Forces to deliver a National Flag and a copy of the 1916 Proclamation of the Irish Republic to every primary school in the country. Proclamation Day will take place on 15<sup>th</sup> March 2016, which has been set aside by The Department of Education as a special day to focus on the 1916 Proclamation and to raise our National Flag. Members of the Defence Forces will visit our school on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> November to present us with our flag and copy of the Proclamation.
